- Established in 1976, the Arizona Cancer Center is one of 40 National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive cancer centers in the nation and the only one serving the entire state of Arizona. The NCI's highest ranking is reserved for centers focusing on patient care as well as basic and clinical research, prevention, education, outreach and training.
- The Cancer Center is a leader in research on women's cancers (breast, ovarian), men's cancers (prostate), gastrointestinal cancers (colon, pancreas, liver), lymphoma and skin cancers.
- The Cancer Center is home to one of the largest Cancer Prevention and Control Programs among the nation's comprehensive cancer centers, with leading prevention research in breast, colon, lung, prostate and skin cancers.
- Including more than \$41 million in National Cancer Institute (NCI) funding, the Cancer Center received more than \$75 million in overall cancer-research project funding during 2008-09.
- The Cancer Center is one of five centers in the nation with an NCI Specialized Program of Research Excellence (SPORE) grant for gastrointestinal cancers. It is also one of five centers in the nation with an NCI SPORE grant for lymphatic cancers.
- The Cancer Center's 60 research labs work to bring the power of research to cancer prevention and treatment by providing a direct link between the latest research discoveries and patient care.
- The Cancer Center operates two primary research sites: one at the University of Arizona in Tucson and the other in Scottsdale. It also has more than a dozen research and education offices throughout the state and affiliate sites in Mexico and Colorado.
- University Medical Center (UMC), the Cancer Center's clinical affiliate in Tucson, is ranked consistently among the nation's premier hospitals in *U.S. News & World Report's* annual guide to "America's Best Hospitals." Hundreds of its doctors are identified among *The Best Doctors in America*.
